BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Phillip H. Kaleida, M.D., is a native of Pittsburgh, PA. He received his undergraduate education at St. Vincent College in Latrobe, PA, and his graduate medical education at the University of Louisville School of Medicine. Dr. Kaleida underwent pediatric residency training at Emory University School of Medicine (Grady Memorial Hospital and the Henrietta Egleston Hospital for Children) in Atlanta, GA. Following five years as a partner in a private pediatric practice, Dr. Kaleida joined the faculty of the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. The next three years were spent working as a member of both the Otitis Media Research Center (Department of Pediatric Otolaryngology) and the Ambulatory Division (Department of Pediatrics) at the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. Since 1985, he has been a full-time member of the Ambulatory Division.

Dr. Kaleida is currently Associate Professor of Pediatrics, Co-Director of the Fellowship in Ambulatory Pediatrics, and Director of the Third-Year Medical Student Pediatric Clerkship Outpatient Rotation. He is a Member of the American Board of Pediatrics and serves on a test committee of the Program for Renewal of Certification in Pediatrics.

As a general academic pediatrician, Dr. Kaleida's interests have included otitis media (particularly, diagnostic and therapeutic issues), breast-feeding (particularly, its potential relationship to otitis media) and medical education (particularly, development and study of educational programs/interventions).

As a member of the Society for Ear, Nose and Throat Advances in Children, Dr. Kaleida has been active as Chairman, Liaison Committee, 1986-88; Member, Board of Directors, 1988-90; President Elect, 1989-90; President, 1990-91; Chairman, Program Committee, 1991-92; and Chairman, Local Arrangements Committee, 1992-93. SENTAC has provided him with the opportunity to formally interact with an international group of health professionals who have a common and focused interest regarding children. He sees as the strengths of the Society its multidisciplinary nature and the comfortable relationship that members seem to have with each other.
