Hi! David Parsons here, the Program Directory for SENTAC-Cincinnati. Having this year's scientific session in one of the "mecca's" of our specialties, it is only appropriate that we tap into the wealth of knowledge available to us in Cincinnati. The volunteers to lead and participate in the program will please all! You will gain tremendously by being a listener at this year's meeting. Besides the largest number of papers ever submitted for podium and poster presentation, we have an awesome selection of panels, honored speakers and lunch breakout sessions.

We had 99 abstracts submitted of which 46 will be presented from the podium. The sessions are divided into seven sections starting with Voice Disorders, Audiology and Otology, Speech Language Pathology, General Pediatric Otolaryngology (2) and the Pediatric Airway (2). Fifty three posters will be presented for your review, with a good glass of wine!

Our honored speakers include *Christine Yoshinaga-Itano*, *PhD*,

from the Department of Speech, Language & Hearing Sciences, University of Colorado, Boulder, CO, receiving the Robert Ruben Award for Excellence in Scientific Advancement: Robert F. Ward, MD, Pediatric Otolaryngology, Cornell University, NYC receiving the Steven Gray Humanitarian Award; Tania Sih, MD, Pediatric Otolaryngology, Sao Paulo, Brazil receiving the Sylvan Stool Award for Excellence in Teaching and Service; and Scott Holland, PhD, Director, Communications Science Research Center, Cincinnati Children's Hospital receiving the Arthrocare Lectureship.

The 4 panels will study "Static and Functional Imaging in Children with Hearing Loss". Hoarseness," "Speech Delay," and "Pediatric Airway Update – 2011." Each panel will have multiple experts in their field giving us insights and being available for a quality question and answer period.

The lunch breakout sessions will offer the wonderful teaching and clinical experience of Blake Papsin, MD, presenting "How to Give an Effective Scientific Talk; Julie Wei, MD, and Christie Yoshinaga-Itano, PhD, discussing "Overcoming Challenges in Career Advancement;" and Stacy Ishman: educating s on "Evaluation of the Sleepy Child:

When Sleepiness is Not Sleep Apnea."

Having not missed a SENTAC since the 1980's, I am pleased to inform you that this could be the best ever! The quality of the abstracts, the enthusiasm of the presenters for all the panels and lunch breakout sessions and the superb honored speakers will make this a meeting to be remembered!
